THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE TEAM IS WORKING ON EDUCATIONAL EVENTS, TRADE MISSIONS, AND TRADE SHOWS THIS SPRING

- A two-part webinar series focused on mitigating supply chain risks was completed in March with 63 attendees.
- The VALET Program's spring meeting will be held on April 28, 2022 in Richmond. This event is open to current participants and alumni.
- VEDP is hosting a briefing by NATO Allied Command Transformation on how defense businesses can participate in NATO's acquisition system on May 17, 2022 in Richmond. Individual one-on-one meetings are also being arranged.
- VEDP is hosting a two-day training seminar focusing on Foreign Military Sales and Foreign Military Financing for defense exporters on May 18-19, 2022 in Richmond.
- The next Supply Chain Program training session will be held at the Port of Virginia on May 17, 2022.
