**Welcome and Call to Order**

**Public Comment Period**

Chair Stone asked if any members of the public wished to comment. There were none.

**Approval of Minutes for June 11, 2025 and September 17, 2025 Meetings**

Chair Stone requested approval of the June 11, 2025, and the September 17, 2025, minutes. Mr. Rush made a motion, seconded by Ms. Oman, and the minutes were unanimously approved as presented.

**General Assembly Special Session Update**

Lindsay Akers, VP of External Affairs, provided an update on mid-decade congressional redistricting, reporting that legislators reconvened during the 2024 Special Session I, where a resolution was passed to allow consideration of a constitutional amendment to redraw Virginia's congressional districts. She noted that the resolution will be considered again in the 2026 General Assembly session, and if approved and subsequently passed by voters in a referendum, the General Assembly would move to redraw district maps ahead of the 2026 congressional primaries.

**Election Update**

Ms. Akers provided an update on the recent statewide election, noting the election of the following statewide officials:

- Abigail Spanberger, Governor-Elect
- Ghazala Hashmi, Lieutenant Governor-Elect
- Jay Jones, Attorney General-Elect

Ms. Akers noted that several published priorities of Governor-Elect Spanberger may have implications for economic development.

Ms. Akers also reported that Democrats expanded their majority in the House of Delegates during the recent election cycle, with gains across competitive and previously

Republican-leaning districts which will result in changes to key committee leadership and membership.

### **Closed Session**

Mr. Rush made a motion, seconded by Mr. Stone, to move to a closed meeting. The members unanimously approved the motion below:

I move that the Legislation and Policy Committee of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership Authority convene a closed meeting to discuss elements of VEDP's Strategic Plan, Marketing Plan, and Operational Plan pursuant to Subdivision A 50 of §2.2-3711 of the Code of Virginia, which allows for the discussion of such activities that would reveal to Commonwealth's competitors for economic development projects the strategies intended to be deployed, thus adversely affecting the financial interests of the Commonwealth.
